

This diabetes clinic is taking part in an important national project about paediatric diabetes care and treatment in the NHS.

This project is called the National Paediatric Diabetes Audit (NPDA).

What is the NPDA?

The NPDA is a comprehensive, national-level initiative in England, Wales and Jersey aimed at evaluating and improving the care provided to children and young people with diabetes.

Taking part in the NPDA shows that this diabetes clinic is committed to improving care for children and young people with diabetes.

What data does the NPDA collect?

The NPDA collects a variety of data to assess and improve the quality of care for children and young people with diabetes. This includes identifiers and demographic data such as NHS number, age, gender, ethnicity, as well as clinical data such as the type of diabetes and the date of diagnosis.

What if I don't want my data to be included in the NPDA?

You can opt out by asking your paediatric diabetes team to not submit your data to the NPDA. You can also inform the NPDA team directly at npda@rcpch.ac.uk. The NPDA is exempt from the National Data Opt-Out. If you have opted-out of sharing your data through the National Data-Opt Out, your data may still be shared with the NPDA team.
