Work Plan Priority 1

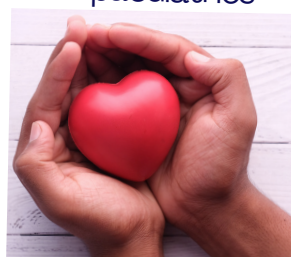
Workforce training and development on engagement
