A comprehensive training programme offered at King's Mill Hospital, Mansfield. This is a district general hospital within Sherwood Forest NHS Hospitals Foundation Trust. The clinical experiences will offer ample opportunity to see and manage (under supervision) children of all ages with a range of medical and/or developmental issues. There is a strong focus on holistic, multiagency working and child health inequalities. Trainees will have the ability to cover all aspects of the CCH curriculum but also with scope to develop more specialist interests in greater depth.

The appointee will usually spend 2 years in Leicester and 1 year in Kettering. The sequence and timing of rotations will be tailored to individual training needs and service needs.

The initial 12 month post is at Chailey Heritage Clinical Services, which is a specialist unit for children and young people with complete needs, offering experience in neurodisability. The second year is spent at Seaside View Child Development Centre, Brighton with acute paediatric on call at Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital, Brighton. The final year is based in the child development centre at Worthing Hospital with acute paediatrics on site. A further 12 months experience will be gained in associate specialities or community child health (CCH) depending on availability and trainee preference to complete a 3-year programme – this could include further time in CCH (Bury, Wigan, Salford, Manchester) or Neurology (Royal Manchester Children's Hospital or Preston). These include the diagnosis and management of long-term neurodisability, neurodevelopment, including social communication difficulties, safeguarding, adoption and fostering and school-based issues, including advice to the local authority. Both rotations have acute on-call duties, Salford being linked with Royal Bolton Hospital and Manchester with Royal Manchester Children's Hospital (RMCH).

These are currently in Kingswood (South Glos), Eastgate house (East-central Bristol), Osprey court,

Higher level resident doctors rotate around these hubs aiming to spend a year in each that they are placed, in order to gain experience of working with different teams and also with different populations. Whilst the full duration of training is offered in community settings, doctors in training may choose to spend time in Bristol Children's Hospital gaining experience in other relevant departments such as neurology if this is appropriate to career aims.

HHFT provides community paediatric services for the cities of Winchester and Basingstoke and surrounding areas. The resident doctor may work across both Winchester and Basingstoke during the programme, with the base unit being Winchester.
West Midlands	West Midlands - Wolverhampton & Stoke on Trent & Shropshire (2025CCHWolvStokShro)	New Cross Hospital, Wolverhampton (12 months) Royal Stoke Hospital, Stoke on Trent (12 months) Shropshire Community Healthcare NHS Trust (12 months)	1	As part of a 3 year West Midlands Community Child Health post, Postgraduate Doctors in training (PGDIT) train in a range of units providing Community care to children in Wolverhampton/ Shropshire and Stoke Time spent working OOH in general paediatrics will not take up more than 30% training time.
