The programme incorporates 18 months general PICM and transport medicine training at Great North Children's Hospital and 6 months cardiac PICM training in the cardiothoracic PICU at Freeman Hospital, both in Newcastle upon Tyne. This is in addition to 6 months standalone training in anaesthetics within NUTH. All PICM trainees are supported to develop the knowledge and skills necessary for both critical care and retrieval medicine. The programme provides complete training in all competencies required by PICM ISAC and in addition, offers training in heart failure and transplantation, and mechanical circulatory support (ECMO, VAD).

North West	North West Mersey - Alder Hey & Betsi Cadwaladr (2025ICMAldeBets)	Alder Hey Children's NHS Foundation Trust (24 months) Ysbaty Glan Clywd Anaesthetics (12 months)	2	We are a busy mixed general and cardiac unit and designated National ECMO + Vein of Galen centre with around 1000 admissions per year. Alder Hey is also a Major Trauma Centre for paediatrics in the Northwest. In October 2015 we moved to a new state of the art Alder Hey Children's Health Park - PICU has expand to a 24 bedded unit with a co-located and separately staffed 16 bedded HDU, 6 bedded burns unit, plus a helipad. This post offers an exciting opportunity for comprehensive training in paediatric intensive care, including resuscitation and advanced paediatric life support and paediatric retrieval training with NWTS (Northwest and North Wales Paediatric Retrieval Service). A full year's anaesthetic placement is strongly encouraged, and we have links with an excellent local DGH to provide this training. During year 2 training there is a focus on increasing experience as 'chief' which entails taking an overall management role for the Unit during the day, and senior trainees are expected to support and supervise less experienced colleagues. In addition, year 2 trainees help coordinate and deliver the regional teaching programme plus organise critical incident and mortality meetings. Organisation of an annual Northwest PCCS Masterclass Day is also encouraged and supported for year 2 trainees. Alder Hey is active on PCCS Council and participation is also encouraged for trainees. There are opportunities to gain bronchoscopy experience both on the unit and with our colleagues in Respiratory Paediatrics, as well as experience in management of LTV patients. From an ECMO point of view we provide regular in-house theoretical and water lab training and run an annual ECMO course for medics and ECMO Specialists. As a unit we are focussed on research opportunities and have an excellent research team. We expect senior trainees to become GCP trained and fully take part in ongoing local, national, and international PIC conferences is strongly supported.

The Northern Irish part of training has flexibility to include 3 months of Paediatric Anaesthesia, and 9 months PICU in RBHSC, the only paediatric hospital in Northern Ireland with 12 PICU beds. The Ulster Hospital in Belfast can provide 6 months of adult anaesthesia training and 3 months of adult ICU. Alder Hey will facilitate 12 months of PICU in a 24-bed unit (16 HCU beds) and 3 months of paediatric transport with the North West Transport Service. Trainees joining the programme requiring only 2.5 years of training can omit the paediatric anaesthesia and adult ICU components. Over 36 months they will work in both inpatient and outpatient settings, with acute and chronic presentations of disease and provide specialist regional advice in a seamless model of shared care with 9 local hospitals.

The training in Edinburgh will include up to 15 months of PICU in RHYCP Edinburgh and 6 months of adult anaesthesia at St John's Hospital, Livingston (located 20 minutes outside Edinburgh). The Glasgow part of the training will encompass 3 months with the paediatric Scotstar retrieval team based at Glasgow airport, and 12 months in RHC Glasgow, a 22 bedded PICU with cardiac and ECMO services alongside general PICU. Trainees joining the program with only 2.5 years remaining will omit 6 months of general PICU in Edinburgh.

Emergency and acute receiving services are supported by the RHC PICU and contributes to the ScotSTAR retrieval service, where applicants will spend time. The unit supports a number of National Services including paediatric cardiac surgery, invasive cardiology, complex airway surgery, renal transplantation and bone marrow transplantation. We are co-located with Queen Elizabeth University Hospital (QEUH) which includes the full range of adult services including maternity and adult critical care.

Our subspeciality post provides experience within the full range of specialities including an extensive cardiac program with an active ECMO component, a complex neurosurgical program which includes national designation for epilepsy surgery, scoliosis surgery, burns intensive care, renal transplantation and palliative care training with dedicated consultants and a bereavement team. Transport training is provided at WATCh (West and Wales Acute Transport for Children) which has its base in Bristol and covers 22 hospitals over a wide area of South West England and South Wales. 2 years of the post are based on PICU with around 25% of shifts working within the transport team and the remaining year depends on previous experience and interests but is usually 6 months of anaesthetics and 6 months of adult intensive care in Gloucester, a commutable distance from Bristol.

There is also a 6-month rotation with Embrace (Yorkshire and Humber Infant and Children's Transport Service) gaining experience in the stabilisation and transfer of both critically ill children and neonates across the region. The postholder will work alongside a highly committed multi-professional team in a leading children's hospital providing family centred care with opportunities to develop clinical, leadership and research skills. As part of the programme we will also ensure the postholder gains appropriate experience in anaesthetics within our region, as well as further opportunities in adult critical care and/or Paediatric Cardiology. Provisional plan for the 36-month programme would be as follows but the order of rotations is subject to change depending on rotation planning and trainee numbers: - 18 months Leeds Children's Hospital PICU - 6 months Embrace Transport Service based just off Junction 37 of the M1 - 6 months Anaesthetics at a location TBC but within the Yorkshire and Humber Deanery taking into account Anaesthetic post availability and trainee preferences - 6 months at Either Adult Critical Care, Paediatric Cardiology with Leeds PICU on call, or Leeds PICU, taking into account post availability and trainee preferences
