Facing the Future: Standards for children with ongoing health needs Implementation Plan

Implementation plans will need to be shared with colleagues in the partnering Colleges; the RCGP and RCN for Together standards; and the RCGP, RCN, RCP and RCPsych for the standards for children with ongoing health needs.

The plan sets out how the Colleges will implement and monitor how services are reaching standards by:

- Supporting and equipping members across the five Colleges with the information and skills to influence at a local level
- Supporting services to implement the standards
- Negotiations / discussions with key stakeholders at national policy level
- Ensuring children and their parents/carers know the quality of care they can expect and their rights
- Sharing standards with commissioners / service planners
- Committing to audit standards at least every three years

Possible activities to support implementation are detailed below:
