Course aim

This study day will enable you to recognise and manage life-threatening paediatric sepsis. It will provide you with the confidence and practical skills to manage sepsis and prescribe in acute scenarios.

- Appraise parents' assessment of their children
- Explain which is the most appropriate antibiotic to choose
- Discuss current issues in fluid resuscitation
- Estimate which inotrope to use, when and how much
- Compare differences in children with complex health conditions
- Differentiate between orders of immunodeficiency
- Analyse appropriate management strategies in these cases
- Practise and assess your knowledge and skills through sepsis simulation scenarios.
