

Learning Points

There is no single antibiotic which always works ... Make sure to refer to local guidelines

Cefuroxime and cephalexin are used for UTI's. Cetotaxime and ceftriaxone are used for generalized sepsis and are good at penetrating into CNS and respiratory tract.



A child with sepsis should be on the maximum dose of antibiotic for their age & weight!



Are you worried about sepsis in a child with a central venous access device in place?

Think about adding teicoplanin or vancomycin to the regime

The microbiologist & the referring doc can make a good team & fit together the pieces of the jigsaw.

When calling microbiology, prioritise the history, results and allergy history





Key points:

- Take good samples

- Start antibiotics early

- Don't panic!
