

## The Lorber Award 2022

John Lorber (1915-1996) was Professor of Paediatrics at the University of Sheffield. He made major contributions to the field of medical ethics, childhood tuberculosis and neural tube defects. The award was established in his memory by his wife.

### Eligibility criteria

This will be awarded to the author of the best article on any subject related to paediatrics published or accepted for publication within one year of 30 November 2021. The award is open to medical practitioners who are registered in the UK and working in pre-consultant grades at the time the relevant scientific paper is accepted for publication.

### Award

The winner will receive their award, consisting of a monetary prize of £200 and certificate, at the RCPCH Annual Conference and Exhibition in 2022. Day entry to the conference will be provided, including reasonable expenses.

### Scoring process

Articles submitted for the award will be judged by an adjudicating committee established by the Academic Board of the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health and will be judged with respect to scientific content, clinical contribution, and presentation. The adjudicating panel may (in exceptional circumstances) award the prize jointly. The results of the competition will be announced in February 2022.

### How to submit your application

Those eligible for and wishing to be considered for 2022 Lorber award should complete the following form and submit a copy of your paper no later than **midnight on 30 November 2021**. ### What information do we collect from you?

Submissions for the award are voluntary and we will only use the personal data you have provided on this form for the application process.

### Who do we share your information with?

Your personal data will be held within the Research & Evidence Team. The judging committee will only see your name and article. Your name and article title will also be published on the RCPCH website and the Annual Conference programme.

We will never transfer your information outside of the EEA.

### How long do we keep your information?

We will retain applications for five years from the year of submission in line with the College Retention Policy. We will then destroy unsuccessful applications and transfer successful nominations to the College's historical archive for long term preservation.

### Your rights
