The separate Paediatric Emergency Department sees approximately 45,000 children and young people each year, with an approximately 40:60 split between trauma and medical presentations. The department is committed to research and education, with an active designated departmental area (DREEAM - Department of Research & Education for Emergency & Acute Medicine).

This period also includes sessions in Paediatric Surgical Specialties at the Great North Children's Hospital and Sunderland Eye Infirmary, and sessions in Paediatric Orthopaedics at Sunderland Royal Hospital (to total 6 months wte training time). We then offer 6 months of Paediatric Intensive Care Medicine at the Great North Children's Hospital, Newcastle. The Great North Children's Hospital opened in 2010 and provides tertiary and quaternary services for infants and children in the North East of England and North Cumbia. The PICU has 18 beds, of which 12 beds are currently funded. The unit admits patients from a wide range of specialties including neurology, neurosurgery, oncology, bone marrow transplantation and trauma. There is also a standalone Transport and Retrieval service alongside which the Trainee will be involved in as part of PICU training.

There will be opportunities to achieve all competencies as set out in Progress+. Third year of programme if required can be tailored to suit the trainee either in emergency paediatrics or in an available subspecialty in RBHSC.

At least 12 months will be spend in Cardiff Emergency department, with the final 6 months being spent in either Cardiff or Swansea depending on other trainees, LTFT and experience. Wales is a great place to live and learn with easy access to mountains and the sea. A wealth of cultural and sporting activities are found in Cardiff, which is a small but vibrant city with a proud heritage!

All trainees will be supported to attend monthly regional training days which are accounted for on the rotas of all three departments and all will have allocated time to access secondment and additional learning opportunities. Our approach to PEM training in Wessex is supportive, collaborative and focused on developing advanced clinical and non-clinical skills. There are many other training opportunities available including trauma team training, procedural sedation, debrief courses and trainees will be able to actively participate in governance process for each department and across the region. Within this time, you will complete 1 year of Paediatric Emergency Medicine training, 6 months of surgical secondments, in which you can access multiple subspecialties, such as Trauma and Orthopaedics, Paediatric Burns, ENT, Paediatric Gynaecology, Paediatric Surgery and Plastic Surgery including specialist hand surgery. You will complete your 2 years, with 6 months of Paediatric Intensive Care, in the largest PICU in the country. We encourage all trainees to be involved in QI projects, teaching, research, and complaints management. Trainees are supported with EDT/CPD time within their work schedule to complete these.
