1. Briefly explain the aims and objectives of your quality improvement activity

Mental health

To introduce routine screening using the Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ) for mental health difficulties, in addition to enquiry in history at each consultation, and to have clearer pathway regarding who to signpost to resources and who to refer to CAMHS.

SUDEP

To improve the proportion of patients where individual risk of SUDEP discussed.

Video platform use

Use of ISLACare Video Platform to improve patient care by having access to videos of suspected seizures in a timely manner, sharing records with MDT team/tertiary opinion where required, explore use for triage to clinic appointments

2. Describe the steps taken to achieve those aims

Mental health

We undertook a prospective pilot study of 21 patients to determine feasibility of use of the SDQ questionnaire in clinic.

SUDEP

We completed a retrospective case note audit Sep 2021 to Sep 2022 based in electronic health care records at Trust, looking at documentation of individual risk discussion of SUDEP with parent/carers and young people in clinic.

Video Platform Use

One of two trusts in the region to participate in pilot trial with Clinical Governance approval.

3. Outline the changes and improvement in epilepsy care which was observed by your work

Mental health

SDQ used regularly in clinic to identify patients at increased risk of mental health issues, and clearer pathway based on scores to indicate whether signposting to resources or referral to mental health team. National and local resources to support mental wellbeing in children and young people were identified to share with patients.

SUDEP

We showed an improvement in the proportion of patients where individual risk SUDEP discussed and documentation of these discussions. Whole team approach ie ESN and consultants. Improved results on Epilepsy 12 audit. Nurses using checklist when providing training and developing comprehensive care plan

Video platform

Data collected by ISLAcare and used to facilitate discussions for funding in the trust for ongoing use. Experiences shared from users with outcomes collected. Meeting with ISLAcare team to address IT issues successfully undertaken.

4. Reflect on what you believe went well in your project and anything you would do differently


All these projects allowed the team to identify practical solutions on how to improve these aspects of patient care.

5. Describe the next steps to your quality improvement
 - We are still awaiting on funding approval for use of Video Platform. Once this is done, would hope our IT system can integrate the videos shared by patients into their medical records.
 - The next step is to explore how can gain funding to allow better access to mental health worker for children and young people with epilepsy in clinic.
