Context	You are a newly appointed consultant
Task	<p>Read the information provided below and prescribe the medication/s for the child as appropriate.</p> <p>During the Safe Prescribing station on the circuit, you must be prepared to discuss your prescription with the assessor. The discussion may include rationale for the medications, modes of action, issue for administration and side effects.</p> <p>You can use the British National Formulary for Children (BNFC) to write the prescription, but you will not have the BNFC with you for the discussion. You may make notes and take them with you.</p>
Information for trainee	<p>30 day old baby born at full term has been off feeds for 12 hours and has a temperature of 39⁰C and is well perfused and not shocked. You have performed a full septic screen and the admission weight is 4.5 kg.</p> <p>You have decided to treat with Flucloxacillin and Gentamicin (as per departmental protocol). Please write a prescription for this.</p> <p>You have decided to provide full maintenance fluids intravenously. Please write the prescription for this also.</p> <p>You may use BNF for children provided.</p>
